Tutoring

Orientation from LPU

In early May Pia and Mathilde were at a board meeting with Landsforum in Aalborg. It was a really efficient and good meeting, where we (of course) said a bunch of clever things that were all very well received.

At the meeting we talked about the Political Conference (PK) that took place in April and what we can improve for the next PK. Our main focus was on general well-being for the participants, and not having too stressful or rushed of a program that both ruins the debate and is hard on the delegations. We also talked about the so-called packages and criticized the sizes of them and the way they were introduced to the delegation leaders. Other than that, we talked about the pretty strict gender perspective – where SR-RUC suggested that we instead focus on marginalized groups in general, as an example between the different (sized) member organizations or international participants. Everyone agreed on this!

We also talked about the process of choosing FU19 in DSF, approved the annual revision, talked a bit about press and had an orientation about the work in ESU (European Student Union). There are some internal problems here that Julian told us about – if you are interested in this you can always contact Pia or Mathilde with questions.

The day after Mathilde had a presentation about uni-elections for the board of the Student Council at AAU. They were very interested and had some quite good and well reflected questions. Also, they are an organization of practically only men, so they spoil me rotten every time I'm there.

That same Sunday Signe was at a meeting with Levevilkårspolitisk Udvalg (LU) (The committee for living conditions, I'm not sure how to translate it). There were different presentations by Kirstine (the vice president of DSF) and someone from LLO (Lejernes Landsorganisation) about the housing market and different problems for students regarding housing. Both good presentations that gave a pretty decent overview of the situation.

They also discussed the results of the preparatory policy subject at PK and decided on different things for Landsforum to decide on before the writing of the policy paper is begun. It seems that there is a pretty wide agreement so far – but are different disagreements that will probably show later.

Other than that, DSF and LO-Ungdom had a conference about cheap housing last Thursday. Mathilde went, and other than being a long day inside on a sunny day, it was a really great conference. Some of the same points from the LU meeting were presented, but it also seemed like Kirstine and DSF actually learned something new from the debate. Kirstine and Rasmus from LOU will now get together and write some recommendations about cheaper housing that they will publish and of course give to the minister. These will of course also be involved with DSF's and LF's further work with the policy paper about student housing.

Orientation from the election committee

The election group has had a meeting about finding election coordinators. It was decided that we will find the coordinators before the meeting in august, where we can formally elect them as a board. We have disused the process of finding coordinators, and we have come up with some criteria for electing them.

Process of finding them:

- Its important that the coordinators can work in a structured manner.
- The coordinators has to have a strategical mindset.
