<u>Discussion</u> – who are our users and would they define our work?

As an organisation, we mainly reach active and engaged students, even though we exist for the purpose of fighting for all students. We rarely reach the students, who only focus on their studies.

We still do our best to fight for all students – also students who do not know, we are fighting for them.

The different groups of students are represented at different times - Supply and demand.

We are a difficult organisation for students to define, because we do so many different things. Students are aware of the fact, that we are a political organisation, but have difficulties seeing and understanding our political work, for example what we have fought for and what we have achieved.

<u>Discussion – which core tasks do we actually perform?</u>

It is very difficult to narrow our work down to core tasks.

We do perform social, academic and political tasks. There is a strength in the different choices, we offer for example through committees. We are a broad and flexible organisation. We also sometimes make it hard for ourselves by being so divided in our core tasks.

Discussion - How do our three core tasks intertwine and how do they differ?

You cannot have a stable social study environment without student representation and vice versa.

Everything we do, is about making studying at RUC just a bit nicer – sometimes for many, sometimes for a few.

Connection between our formal tasks, experienced tasks, and executed tasks.

A core task is also to ensure the free choice – 'no matter who you and what you are interested in, we (SR) have a place of you'.

'Who are better to improve life for student than students'.

The ability to enact change and to improve life for students.

We do this, because we can see some of the changes, we pushed for.

Provide students with a voice by organising students.
