## Presenting the working plans

- Kick: not present
- LPU: Very similar to the one last year, because the role doesn't change much.
- SEC: Everything is pretty hypothetical because we don't know what we can do due to corona. No events this semester, but maybe next semester.
- Stud. Rep: special focus on starting and expanding the network for representatives. Host
  monthly meetings and 3 big evets each semester. Would be nice to upscale the network,
  so the representatives can use it to collaborate with unipol and across departments and
  study boards.
- Subject council network: more self-determination
- FANE:
- Academic committee: focusing on English events, though one in Danish. At least 2 events
  each semester, hope for at least 100 participants each semester. Wish to collaborate with
  unions. They want to evaluate on their events and have fun as well. 3 events planned, one
  this semester and 2 next semester.

### UNIPOL:

- International focus: english policy both for students and lectures. Emails and other information should be available both in dansih and English, so everybody feels included
- Opportunity and welfare: force this down on all other agendas. Focus on the strategy for the reopening of campus.
- Prioritized HUM: make HUM feel welcome and prioritized by ensuring the supervisors and project groups is adequate and meaningful.
- Basis on NAT: focus on the project work, so all NAT students are able to do the projects they personally wish to do. General focus on the learning outcome.
- Representations areas in AR: keep working on this so every fagområde is ensured representation.
- Ensuring student involvement: keep the rectorate from making top-down decisions, when they should be made locally. When they are not, we will be vocal about it.
   Supporting the study boards.

- Study environment at SAM: change ISE record of having the worst study environment. Mapping the study environment of other departments to see why it works other places, and then telling this to the right people, and forcing them to change it forever.
- Master's reform: getting close to the end of it, so the goal is now to ensure a good transition period for those who have already started at RUC and of course has some specific expectations. Focus on the democracy in the rest of the process. Local decisions and skills to those who have to make the decisions.
- Environment: climate is still important, so we will continue to make RUC take responsibility for it. The pandemic is incorporated now: enough bins for the face masks.
- Accessibility: break down barriers for students both physical and mental. Thinking this into the future renovations of campus.
- IT-transparency: collect all information so everything relevant can be found on one database.
- Everybody is satisfied with the working plans for the different committees.

# Saturday 13th

## **Annual cycle**

Getting divided into our different comitees and work-groups. Where we can put in different deadlines/events/meetings into the annual cycle.

Wilken ask us to answer following

- 1. Is this the best format to use for this?
- 2. What should our committee/Working-group put in the annual cycle?

Maria: Because of the different columns. It feels like the committees are separated.

Mathilde: It's more of a calendar for all the committees and entire SR. Missing some more abstract goals, where discussion-subjects could be added.

Sif: Want to create a more collectively cycle, where the different committees works together.

Marc: Like the format. The separation of tasks work really well.

Wilken: Could it be a solution to keep a calendar for the different committees, and a different page for common goals within the SR.

Mathilde: Big props to Wilken, and supports Wilkens idea.

We voted for approving the Annual Cycle, with possible extensionable suggestions.

## Sunday 14th

If you buy both alcohol and food/snacks etc. you have to make sure to have it on two different receipts, otherwise RUC won't give money back cause they don't want to pay for our alcohol, which is kind of understandable.

The final Accounting of 2020 is nearly done. Needs final approval and if we don't like it we can just go ahead and fire Mariaaa. We're waiting for VAT Accounting but we should have money left to pay for it.

In 2019 RUC gave us too much money – we need to pay it back at some point. The Accounting looks great in general, although we didn't make any money last year, which kind of suck, but we didn't go in minus!

Mariaaa did a beautiful budget with pretty colours, this can be found on our webside/teams, not sure, but it should be possible to find when it's done.

We don't know about Unions yet but we'll probably get less money this year cause of the hole corona-thingy.

We are applying for the DUF-pulje to get some aid due to us not making money last year. We got it last year but might get a bit less this year.

**Unipol**: Waiting for Stud.Rep to be up and running and then force them to be friends and use them to get out messages and contact students outside the group. Generally some information sharing and making new friends – just get to work it'll be great!
